THE CLOSELINE PROJECT



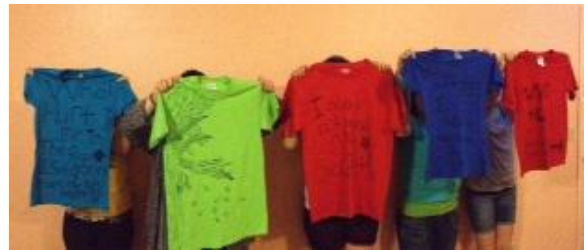
The Clothesline Project (CLP) is a program started on Cape Cod, MA, in 1990 to address the issue of violence against women. It is a vehicle for women affected by violence to express their emotions by decorating a shirt. They then hang the shirt on a clothesline to be viewed by others as testimony to the problem of violence against women. With the support of many, it has spread world-wide.

Local CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) director Rhonda Stubbs asked Brooke Place residents to express their emotions for a Clothesline Project to mark child abuse awareness month. Ms.

Stubbs supplied the t-shirts, and the girls chose a color that references violence against them: red for rape; blue for bullying; and green for physical and child abuse.

Our girls spilled out their emotions (anger, hurt, betrayal, frustration, mistrust) and their thoughts about healing: "I won't be a victim again!"
